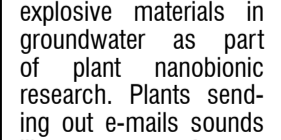

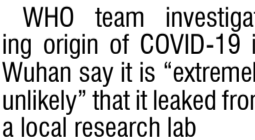

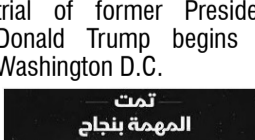

## Parties focus on 'hate speech', paid news in talks with CEC

Lucknow, Dec 31: Chief Election Commissioner Sushil Chandra on Thursday said all political parties in Uttar Pradesh want the Assembly elections to be held according to schedule while ensuring Covid protocol.

The CEC also asked the State to step up coronavirus vaccination. The number of polling booths will be increased and the voting time enhanced by an hour, he said, adding polling officials will be vaccinated and those eligible will be given a booster dose.

Chandra said some parties have also

expressed concern over hate speeches, paid news and "biased" officials.

On a three-day visit to Lucknow to review preparations for the elections slated to be held before mid-March, Chandra held a series of meetings with representatives of political parties as well as state and district-level officials.

The Allahabad High Court had on December 23 suggested the Union Government defer the Uttar Pradesh Assembly elections due to a possible Omicron-led third COVID

wave.

"I have been told that 86 per cent of people in the state have got the first dose and 49 per cent the second shot of COVID vaccine. We have been assured that in 15 to 20 days, all eligible people will get their first dose. We have asked for increasing vaccination," he told reporters on the last day of his visit.

He said because of the pandemic, the number of polling booths in the state will be increased by 11,000 to maintain proper social distancing.

"Earlier, a booth was made for 1,500 voters. But keeping in mind the Covid pandemic, the number of voters in each booth has been reduced to 1,250. Because of this, the number of polling booths has increased by 11,000. So, a total of 1,74,351 polling booths will be set up," he said.

Chandra said besides the Naxal-infested areas, polling time will also be increased by an hour across the state.

Polling officials will be vaccinated and those eligible will be given a

booster dose, he said.

Thermal scanners, sanitisers and masks will be provided at all polling booths and special care will be on maintaining social distancing and proper sanitisation, he said.

Every polling booth will function as per the COVID-19 protocol, he said.

For the first time, senior citizens above 80 years of age, people with disabilities and those affected by COVID-19 will be provided with the alternative facility of

postal voting sitting at home.

If they want to come to the polling centre to cast their vote, they are welcome or else the commission will reach their doorstep, he said.

The list of all such voters will be given to political parties and a videography team will go to their homes.

During this, care will be taken that the secrecy of voting maintained, he said. Chandra said there will be at least 800 women-managed polling stations. A mobile application named "CVIGIL" has been launched to prevent any malpractice in voting, he said.

## MEA rejects China move on Arunachal, asserts State integral to India

New Delhi, Dec 31: India on Thursday rejected China renaming some places in Arunachal Pradesh and asserted that the state has "always been" and will "always be" an integral part of India as assigning "invented" names does not alter this fact.

India's assertion came in response to Beijing announcing Chinese names for 15 more places in Arunachal Pradesh which the neighbouring country claims as South Tibet.

"We have seen

such reports. This is not the first time China has attempted such a renaming of places in the State of Arunachal Pradesh. China had also sought to assign such names in April 2017," External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said.

"Arunachal Pradesh has always been, and will always be an integral part of India. Assigning invented names to places in Arunachal Pradesh does not alter this fact," he said.

Bagchi was responding

to a media query on reports that China has renamed some places in Arunachal Pradesh in its own language.

China's Ministry of Civil Affairs announced on Wednesday that it had standardised in Chinese characters, Tibetan and Roman alphabet the names of 15 places in Zangnan, the Chinese name for Arunachal Pradesh, according to state-run Global Times.

This is in accordance with regulations on geographical names issued by the State

Council, China's cabinet, it said in a report.

Among the official names of the 15 places, which were given exact longitude and latitude, eight are residential places, four are mountains, two are rivers and one is a mountain pass, the report said.

This is the second batch of standardised names of places in Arunachal Pradesh given by China.

The first batch of the standardised names of six places was released in 2017.

## India votes in favour of UNSC resolution on counter terrorism

United Nations, Dec 31:

India, which will chair the UN Security Council's Counter-Terrorism Committee (CTC) in 2022, voted in favour of a resolution to renew the mandate of the CTC Executive Directorate, as it called on nations to remain united against the "tendency of labelling terror acts based on its motivation".

The UN Security Council, through its written silence procedure, renewed the mandate of the Counter-Terrorism Committee Executive Directorate (CTED) until December 31, 2025. An interim review will be conducted in December 2023.

India Thursday voted in favour of UNSC resolution to renew

of Counter-Terrorism Committee Executive Directorate @UN\_CTED. India will chair the #CounterTerrorism Committee of #SecurityCouncil from 1 January 2022 for one year, India's Permanent Representative to the UN Ambassador T S Tirumurti tweeted.

In its explanation of vote, India said it is committed to pursue all necessary measures in collaboration with other member states towards the goal of zero tolerance for terrorism.

As the Chair of CTC for 2022, India will make determined efforts to further enhance the role of CTC in strengthening the multilateral response to counter terrorism, and more importantly, ensuring that global response to the threat

of terrorism remains unambiguous, undivided and effective, India said in the explanation of vote.

India further called on Member States to remain united against the tendency of labelling acts of terrorism based on its motivation. Such categorisation will lead the global community back to the pre-9/11 era of my terrorist versus your terrorist.

We cannot allow anyone anywhere providing any kind of justification for terrorist acts. Combating terrorism must be at the centre of Our Common Agenda, not at its periphery, India said.

The CTC is assisted by the Executive Directorate (CTED), which carries out its policy decisions and conducts expert

assessments of the 193 United Nations Member States.

CTED conducts country visits on the Counter-Terrorism Committee's behalf to assess Member States' counter-terrorism efforts, including progress made, remaining shortfalls, and priority areas for technical assistance needs, as well as to identify terrorism-related trends and challenges and good practices employed in the implementation of relevant Security Council resolutions, the CTC website said.

India, which wrapped up the first year of its two-year term as non-permanent UNSC member, chaired the Taliban Sanctions Committee and the Libya Sanctions Committee this year.

## India-South Korea to enhance bilateral military ties

New Delhi, Dec 31: Chief of Air Staff, Air Chief Marshal V.R. Chaudhari held extensive talks with the top military brass of the Republic of Korea to further enhance bilateral military ties.

The Chief of Air Staff (CAS) was on a four-day trip to the Republic of Korea from Monday.

"As part of the visit, #CAS called on Minister of National Defence & Chairman Joint Chiefs of Staff. CAS also met Chief of Staff of the Republic of Korea Air Force. Wide ranging issues on enhancing bilateral defence engagement were discussed during the meetings," the IAF tweeted on Thursday.

Earlier this month, India and the Republic of Korea agreed to

strengthen strategic cooperation including in dealing with challenges of terrorism, extremism and radicalisation.

The two sides discussed a range of key issues at the third India-Republic of Korea strategic dialogue held in the national capital on December 3.

South Korea has been a major supplier of weapons and military equipment to India.

In 2019, the two countries finalised a roadmap for cooperation in the joint production of various land and naval systems.

It is Air Chief Marshal Chaudhari's second visit abroad after becoming the Chief of Air Staff. Last month, he had visited Egypt.
